



United Way Community Impact Funding Request for Proposal(s) July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023

The United Way of Greater Plymouth County RFP is a one-step submission process with all forms and required attachments due on the same date (detailed below).

All agencies/organizations applying for funding through the United Way of Greater Plymouth County **must complete** the Organization & Eligibility Profile with all required documentation.

Completed Organization & Eligibility Profile, along with all required documentation, must be delivered in **hard copy format** to the United Way of Greater Plymouth County, 934 West Chestnut Street, Brockton, Massachusetts **on or before 4:00 p.m. FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2022**. No electronic submissions, please.

Only submit **one** Organization & Eligibility Profile, along with all required documentation, per agency/organization regardless of how many proposals you plan to submit.

Initiative Narrative Proposals

Agencies/organizations applying for United Way funding, addressing the five Community Impact Recovery Need Areas, **must complete** and **return** Initiative Narrative Proposal and Proposed Initiative Budget forms.

Completed Initiative Narrative Proposal and Proposed Initiative Budget forms must be delivered in **hard copy format (one copy)** to United Way of Greater Plymouth County, 934 West Chestnut Street, Brockton, Massachusetts. Please submit **one set** for **each** Initiative proposed. **Additionally, please e-mail submissions of Initiative Narrative and Budget to kscotland@uwgpc.org. One (1) hard copy and one (1) electronic copy of both Initiative Narrative Proposal and Proposed Initiative Budget must be received on or before 4:00 p.m. FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2022.**

Please note that the Initiative Narrative should be submitted in bullet point format utilizing Arial font size 11 and must remain in the defined blocks.

Agencies may only submit one (1) RFP per LIVE UNITED Recovery Fund focus area for a maximum of five (5) initiatives funded. All proposals will be reviewed and scored on merit to address and/or be a resolution to a specific Community Impact Recovery Need Area.

LIVE UNITED Community Recovery Focus Areas:

- Feeding Our Families
- Housing & Homelessness
- Access to Affordable Health Services
- Support for Children & Youth
- Support for Job Training & Placement

Requests are to be within the range of a minimum of \$5,000 and a maximum of \$30,000 per initiative.

All agencies/organizations must be in compliance with United Way of Greater Plymouth County (adhere to all requirements in the Partner Agency Compliance Agreement and have submitted all Year End Reports) in order to have their RFP's accepted and reviewed.

Agencies may receive funding in two ways:

- United Way Allocations distributed monthly.
- Donor Designations to specific organization distributed on a quarterly *collected* basis. Designations will include a processing/administration fee which will be charged on the paid designations at a reasonable percentage and in compliance with United Way Worldwide Schedule M. This fee will be a board approved rate.

Total United Way support will be comprised of both of these two funding sources.
