



Who is Eligible for WIC?

Massachusetts residents with low to moderate income that are pregnant, post-partum or have children under age 5



- Pregnant women may enroll as soon as they think they are pregnant
- Immigrant families are welcome at WIC
- Foster children under 5 years are automatically qualified
- Women up to 6 months after delivery and breastfeeding women up to 1 year
- Moms, Dads, grandparents and any guardian of a child under
 5 years old may enroll on the child's behalf

Role of Foster Parents

- To provide care for children/youth while the agency helps their family address issues that would allow them to return home.
- Meet the needs of children/youth placed in your home. Provide them with physical and emotional support.
- To work collaboratively with DCF. As a foster parent you are an essential part of the team and an advocate for children and youth placed in your home.

Eligibility

- You do not have to be a certain kind of person or family, successful foster parents come from many walks of life and represent all kinds of families.
- You can be single, married, partnered, divorced or widowed.
- You can rent or own a home.
- You can live in any town in Massachusetts.
- We encourage those to apply that speak different languages.
- We do not discriminate against race, age, martial status, disability, gender identity or expression.

Eligibility II

- Complete an application that will then be processed by a recruiter.
 All household members who are 15 years or older will need to have a background check conducted.
- Recruiter will then arrange a time to meet with the applicant and continue to discuss eligibility. Home will be inspected for physical space and safety.
- For those who may have additional questions can be connected to a foster parent ambassador.
- Upon meeting eligibility recruiter will discuss MAPP and review training schedule that works for applicant.

Massachusetts Approach to Partnerships and Parenting

- Gives a foundation to what to expect when Fostering/Adopting from DCF.
- Good time to access if foster care is right for you and your family.
- The MAPP experience is designed as a mutual assessment process.
- The training includes 10 modules that cover topics such as mental health, understanding how trauma impacts children, helping children transition and etc.
- MAPP is 30 hours of training and there are many options offered to families statewide.

License Study

- After the third session of MAPP you will be assigned a Family Resource Worker and begin the license study process.
- Family Resource Worker will schedule a time to come out to your home and interview household members (as appropriate by age and verbal capacity). This includes individual interviews with applicant and co-applicant.
- The license study is a thorough assessment of personal characteristics and home environments of applicants to ensure that they are able to provide safe, nurturing homes that are in the best interests of the children.

Ongoing Support

- You will be assigned a family resource worker who will visit your home and be your point of contact and support.
- Additional support includes foster parent support groups, monthly trainings, family resource liaison and the helpline.
- Masshealth is provided for all children that come into care with DCF for medical and dental services.



What is In Home Therapy (IHT)?

IHT Therapy is designed to help families with children **ages 3-21** that have severe behavioral and emotional challenges. An experienced therapist and team member will meet with you 2-3 times a week to create a plan to address current problems and help accomplish your goals.

How do we help families?

-Develop routine & structure
-Advocate for necessary resources
-Teach children better ways to manage feelings

-Improve listening & communication
-Work with your child's school
-Develop strategies to reduce emotional outbursts



Intensive Family Therapy Program

Who is eligible?

- Children 3-21 with Masshealth plans with MBHP/Tufts coverage
- Children 3-19 with Commercial plans with BHCA benefits

Criteria for Admission:

- More intense need than traditional 45 minute therapy provides
- Parental participation

What does IHT look like?

- Support provided in multiple configurations: parent meetings, individual therapy, family therapy, sibling support.
 - Treatment plan designed with family to address acute needs.
 - Child's team is contacted to review treatment and coordinate care.
 - Natural supports engaged



Therapeutic Mentoring Program

Who is eligible?

- Children 3-21 with Masshealth plans with MBHP/Tufts coverage
- Children 3-19 with Commercial plans with BHCA benefits

Criteria for Admission:

- Active participation with IHT therapist, individual therapist, or ICC
- Skill building assigned by "Hub" therapist

What does Therapeutic Mentoring look like?

- Community based opportunities to learn/practice skills identified by therapist
- TM addresses: social skill development, emotional control, gaining practical skills
 - Weekly contact between mentor and "Hub" therapist to review progress
 - Ongoing contact with parent to review progress



FIRST Steps Together is currently accepting new referrals!

Services are currently being offered via telehealth AND in person home/community visits dependent on participant need and comfort. All aspects of the program are free and open to all who meet the eligibility criteria listed below. Our referral form is attached to this email for your convenience.

Services include:

Family Recovery Support Specialists (FRSS)- Recovery Coaches with specialized training in evidence-based parenting and recovery interventions. They can assist in coordinating amongst providers, relapse prevention planning, safety planning, and Plans of Safe Care/ pregnancy binders. The program has both male and female

FRSSs on staff to provide the best fit possible for our participants.

Clinical Services- Counseling is an optional aspect of the program. Our clinician is available to enrolled participants in need of additional clinical support. Counseling can be provided for individuals or in support of the parent-child dyad.

Groups- Open to the public. Current offerings include Women's Recovery Support, Dad's in Recovery Support, and Relapse Prevention. Contact us for details and zoom links.


